# **Reflections**

# **Council Reports**

### **Annual Meeting Minutes**

#### January 28, 2024

President Joe Blackbird called the meeting to order. 47 members were in attendance. Brian and Dawn handed out the Annual Reports packet. Pastor Barry opened the meeting with prayer.

Clipboards were passed around for those in attendance to sign-up for ushering / custodial / communion duties. Joe thanked Pastor Barry for pastoring St. John's Church through our transition.

- Pam Martin read the minutes from the 2023 Annual Meeting. The minutes were approved as presented.
- Review of the Annual Reports were given as follows:
  - **General Fund, Memorial Fund, Choir Fund, and Congregational Direct Giving were given** by Dawn Norrbom. A question was asked regarding the \$40,000.00 transfer to the building fund. It was explained that \$5,000.00 was needed for expenses and the remaining \$35,000.00 was transferred to the Vanguard account where it earns more interest.
  - Membership & Attendance Record by Karen Konerza
  - **Benevolence** by Karen Konerza
  - **Building Fund** by Brian Alsleben.
  - Women's Guild by Brenda Schaefer
  - Youth Group by Andrea Wigern
  - Sunday School by Brenda Garoutte
  - **Financial Review** report was given by Pam Martin. She stated that the review committee found the financial records for 2023 were accurate and in good order.

Motion/Second/Carried to approve all reports as presented.

### New Business:

- Joe Blackbird presented the 2024 **Operating Budget**. Mary Huebert donated her organist services again this year. (Thanks Mary!). The Secretary's salary and Organist's salary would stay the same. Some of the categories were increased slightly while some were decreased. The total budget is \$82,450. In order to meet the budget, on average, each family unit will need to contribute about \$2,860 total for the year. This equates to about \$55 for 52 weeks. M/S/C to accept the budget.
- Joe Blackbird reviewed the proposed 2024 service times and dates. Easter service will be at 9:30a.m. as well as the Thanksgiving service. It was suggested that we place an ad in the local papers to reflect these starting times. Congregation approved.
- The women's guild asked for congregational approval to offer a gift of \$10,000.00 to Pastor "H" from their funds. This could be used towards a down payment or any updates to a house when he finds one. M/S/C.
- There was a question if we thought about celebrating the Church's 160<sup>th</sup> Anniversary next year. The council will discuss along with the new Pastor when he gets here.
- David Swift gave an update on the Endowment Fund. He highlighted how the fund works and to consider this fund in your giving or estate planning so we can grow the great gift that the Nemitz's began. Funding available for distribution in 2025 will be \$2,832.28.
- Volunteers/Staff Elections
  - **Council** Joe Blackbird and Brian Alsleben have completed their second term on the council. Elmer Baysinger completed his first term and will serve a second. Dave Swift and Deb Froemming volunteered to be on the council. M/S/C to elect Dave and Deb to the council for their first terms.
  - **Ice Cream Social Committee** June 13<sup>th</sup>, 2024. Brenda Garoutte, Jody Sanken, and Julie Karl volunteered. Any other members are welcome to join as well.

- **Financial Review Committee** Pam Martin, Brenda Garoutte, and Brian Alsleben will be on the committee again.
- **Benevolence Committee** Elaine Carrigan volunteered to stay on. Mavis Mielke was contacted to see if she will serve again and she said she would.
- Nursery Committee Michelle Alsleben, Zachary Zeleke.
- Records Keeper Karen Konerza
- $\circ$  M/S/C to accept the above committee volunteers.

A motion was made and seconded to adjourn the meeting. Motion carried.

Discussion was made on the duties of the council. Everyone serving another term/year volunteered to keep their current positions. Dave volunteered to be president and Deb volunteered to be the building fund treasurer. M/S/C to accept their new positions. Welcome to both!!

Dave called the meeting to order and opened with prayer.

The secretary's minutes were approved from the January 17<sup>th</sup> meeting.

Dawn gave the treasurer's report. The beginning balance was \$45,623.69 with an ending balance after the restricted funds were paid out at the end of the year of \$53,052.71.

### March 12<sup>th</sup>, 2024

Council Members Present: All members were present as well as Pastor Barry.

Dave called the meeting to order and Pastor Barry opened with prayer.

The secretary's minutes were approved from the February 13<sup>th</sup> meeting.

Dawn gave the treasurer's report. The beginning balance was \$53,052.71 with an ending balance of \$58,431.86.

Deb gave the building fund report. The balance in the checking account is \$6,453.94 and the Vanguard account balance is \$117,335.07. She also mentioned that she received the land rent check of \$8,250 which will be deposited into the checking account.

Pastor Barry shared some topics that he wanted to share with the council:

• Casey Blackbird will graduate from the Seminary in May – Pastor Barry will make announcements in Church if anyone would like to give any of their offering directly to Casey. He will also ask Casey if he

would like to do a short (4 week) preaching series so that he could include it on a resume. Council approved.

- $\circ$  He would like to see the Church have a summer music festival. He would put together a committee to research options for a band, costs, dates, etc. M/S/C to allow this committee to do the research and report back to the council what they find.
- Pastor Barry would also like to establish a "Young Christians for Jesus Group" (20's and 30's) which would maybe include Bible study/Christian Missions. He will work on this.
- He is also exploring short Bible studies (conversational) for the fall -(4-6 weeks long)
