PASTOR SEARCH UPDATE

The committee has been researching two paths for finding a permanent pastor: sharing a pastor with another small church, and finding a part time pastor. After looking into some possibilities in Brownton and Norwood, it was found that there are no sharing opportunities at this time. Pastor Ron Hamilton from the CCCC's was also exploring possible options with seminary students. This would more likely be a situation where new pastors gain experience with us and then move on. Pastor Ron made contact with Bethel College, but they have not yet responded with interest.

In looking for a permanent pastor, the committee advertised in the Christian Chronicle paper in cities and by word of mouth through other local pastors. We received a handful of resumes through those sources. The committee is in the process of interviewing 2 possible candidates.
