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### Reflections

HE DIDN'T TELL IT BY WAY OF COMPLAINT; IN FACT, EVERY OTHER SENTENCE WAS FAITH IS NOT ABOUT EVERYTHING TURNING OUT OK; IT'S ABOUT BEING OK NO MATTER HOW THINGS TURN OUT.

OUR HOUSE WAS DIRECTLY ACROSS THE STREET FROM THE CLINIC ENTRANCE OF JOHNS HOPKINS HOSPITAL IN BALTIMORE. WE LIVED DOWNSTAIRS AND RENTED THE UPSTAIRS ROOMS TO OUT-PATIENTS AT THE CLINIC.

ONE SUMMER EVENING AS I WAS FIXING SUPPER, THERE WAS A KNOCK AT THE DOOR. I OPENED IT TO SEE A TRULY AWFUL LOOKING MAN. "WHY, HE'S HARDLY TALLER THAN MY 8-YEAR-OLD," I THOUGHT AS I STARED AT THE STOOPED, SHRIVELED BODY. BUT THE AP-

PALLING THING WAS HIS FACE, LOPSIDED FROM SWELLING, RED AND RAW."

YET HIS VOICE WAS PLEASANT AS HE SAID, "GOOD EVENING. I'VE COME TO SEE IF YOU'VE A ROOM FOR JUST ONE NIGHT. I CAME FOR A TREATMENT THIS MORNING FROM THE EASTERN SHORE, AND THERE'S NO BUS 'TIL MORNING."

HE TOLD ME HE'D BEEN HUNTING FOR A ROOM SINCE NOON BUT WITH NO SUCCESS, NO ONE SEEMED TO HAVE A ROOM. "I GUESS IT'S MY FACE... I KNOW IT LOOKS TERRIBLE, BUT MY DOCTOR SAYS WITH A FEW MORE TREATMENTS..."

FOR A MOMENT I HESITATED, BUT HIS NEXT WORDS CONVINCED ME: "I COULD SLEEP IN THIS ROCKING CHAIR ON THE PORCH. MY BUS LEAVES EARLY IN THE MORNING."

I TOLD HIM WE WOULD FIND HIM A BED, BUT TO REST ON THE PORCH... I WENT INSIDE AND FINISHED GET-TING SUPPER. WHEN WE WERE READY, I ASKED THE OLD MAN IF HE WOULD JOIN US. "NO, THANK YOU. I HAVE PLENTY." AND HE HELD UP A BROWN PAPER BAG.

WHEN I HAD FINISHED THE DISHES, I WENT OUT ON THE PORCH TO TALK WITH HIM A FEW MINUTES. IT DID-N'T TAKE A LONG TIME TO SEE THAT THIS OLD MAN HAD AN OVERSIZED HEART CROWDED INTO THAT TINY BODY. HE TOLD ME HE

FISHED FOR A LIVING TO SUPPORT HIS DAUGHTER, HER 5 CHILDREN, AND HER HUSBAND, WHO WAS HOPE-LESSLY CRIPPLED FROM A BACK INJURY.

PREFACE WITH A THANKS TO GOD FOR A BLESSING. HE WAS GRATEFUL THAT NO PAIN ACCOMPANIED HIS DISEASE, WHICH WAS APPARENTLY A FORM OF SKIN CANCER. HE THANKED GOD FOR GIVING HIM THE STRENGTH TO KEEP GOING...

AT BEDTIME, WE PUT A CAMP COT IN THE CHILDREN'S ROOM FOR HIM. WHEN I GOT UP IN THE MORNING, THE BED LINENS WERE NEATLY FOLDED AND THE LITTLE MAN WAS OUT ON THE PORCH.

HE REFUSED BREAKFAST, BUT JUST BEFORE HE LEFT FOR HIS BUS, HALTINGLY, AS IF ASKING A GREAT FA-VOR, HE SAID, "COULD I PLEASE COME BACK AND STAY THE NEXT TIME I HAVE A TREATMENT? I WON'T PUT YOU OUT A BIT. I CAN SLEEP FINE IN A CHAIR." HE PAUSED A MOMENT AND THEN ADDED, "YOUR CHILDREN MADE ME FEEL AT HOME. GROWNUPS ARE BOTHERED BY MY FACE, BUT CHILDREN DON'T SEEM TO MIND."

I TOLD HIM HE WAS WELCOME TO COME AGAIN.

AND, ON HIS NEXT TRIP, HE ARRIVED A LITTLE AFTER 7 IN THE MORNING. AS A GIFT. HE BROUGHT A BIG FISH AND A QUART OF THE LARGEST OYSTERS I HAD EVER SEEN! HE SAID HE HAD SHUCKED THEM THAT MORNING BEFORE HE LEFT SO THAT THEY'D BE NICE AND FRESH. I KNEW HIS BUS LEFT AT 4:00 A.M. AND I WONDERED WHAT TIME HE HAD TO GET UP IN ORDER TO DO THIS FOR US.

IN THE YEARS HE CAME TO STAY OVERNIGHT WITH US, THERE WAS NEVER A TIME THAT HE DID NOT BRING US FISH OR OYSTERS OR VEGETABLES FROM HIS GARDEN. OTHER TIMES WE RECEIVED PACKAGES IN THE MAIL, ALWAYS BY SPECIAL DELIVERY; FISH AND OYSTERS PACKED IN A BOX OF FRESH YOUNG SPINACH OR

KALE, EVERY LEAF CAREFULLY WASHED. KNOWING THAT HE MUST WALK 3 MILES TO MAIL THESE, AND KNOWING HOW LITTLE MONEY HE HAD MADE THE GIFTS DOUBLY PRECIOUS.

WHEN I RECEIVED THESE LITTLE REMEMBRANCES, I OFTEN THOUGHT OF A COMMENT OUR NEXT-DOOR NEIGHBOR MADE AFTER HE LEFT THAT FIRST MORNING. "DID YOU KEEP THAT AWFUL LOOKING MAN LAST NIGHT? I TURNED HIM AWAY! YOU CAN LOSE ROOMERS BY PUTTING UP SUCH PEOPLE!"

MAYBE WE DID LOSE ROOMERS ONCE OR TWICE. BUT, OH!, IF ONLY THEY COULD HAVE KNOWN HIM, PERHAPS THEIR ILLNESSES WOULD HAVE BEEN EASIER TO BEAR. I KNOW OUR FAMILY ALWAYS WILL BE GRATEFUL TO HAVE KNOWN HIM; FROM HIM WE LEARNED WHAT IT WAS TO ACCEPT THE BAD WITHOUT COMPLAINT AND THE GOOD WITH GRATITUDE TO GOD.

RECENTLY WHILE VISITING A FRIEND, WHO HAS A GREENHOUSE, AS SHE SHOWED ME HER FLOWERS, WE CAME TO THE MOST BEAUTIFUL ONE OF ALL, A GOLDEN CHRYSANTHEMUM, BURSTING WITH BLOOMS. BUT TO MY GREAT SURPRISE, IT WAS GROWING IN AN OLD DENTED, RUSTY BUCKET. I THOUGHT TO MYSELF, "IF THIS WERE MY PLANT, I'D PUT IT IN THE LOVELIEST CONTAINER I HAD!"

MY FRIEND CHANGED MY MIND. "I RAN SHORT OF FLOWER POTS," SHE EXPLAINED, "AND KNOWING HOW BEAUTIFUL THIS ONE WOULD BE, I THOUGHT IT WOULDN'T MIND STARTING OUT IN THIS OLD PAIL. IT'S JUST FOR A LITTLE WHILE, TILL I CAN PUT IT OUT IN THE GARDEN."

#### **Council:**

### Annual Meeting Minutes January 26, 2025

President Dave Swift called the meeting to order. 45 members were in attendance. The Annual Report packets were handed out to members. Pastor Bjorn opened the meeting with prayer.

Clipboards were passed around for those in attendance to sign-up for ushering / custodial / altar guild for the upcoming months. The call list was also passed so that members could update phone numbers if needed. Sheets for direct deposit giving as well as signing up for the newsletter via email were also passed on clipboards for those members interested.

- Pam Martin read the minutes from the 2024 Annual Meeting. The minutes were approved as presented.
- Review of the Annual Reports were given as follows:

- General Fund, Memorial Fund, Choir Fund, Congregational Direct Giving and Benevolence by Dawn Norrbom.
- o Women's Guild by Brenda Schaefer
- o Sunday School by Brenda Garoutte
- o Youth Group by Andrea Wigern
- o Membership & Attendance Record by Dave Swift
- o **Building Fund** by Dave Swift. He also explained this position.
- Endowment Fund by Dave Swift. Dave explained how this fund works and the form that
  needs to be filled out to request funds. (Forms need to be given to a member of the Endowment Committee by October of the current year to be voted on at the next Annual Meeting.)
- The Financial Review report was given by Brian Alsleben. He stated that the review committee found the financial records for 2024 were accurate and in good order.

Joe Blackbird made a motion to approve all reports as presented. Seconded by Dave Huebert. Members approved.

#### **New Business:**

- Dave Swift asked Pastor Bjorn to step out of the meeting while he presented the 2025 **Operating Budget**. Mary Huebert donated her organist services again this year. (Thanks Mary!). The Secretary's salary includes a one dollar an hour raise, while the organist amount will stay the same. Some of the categories were increased slightly while some were decreased. The total budget is \$104,670. In order to meet the budget, on average, each family unit will need to contribute about \$3,690 total for the year. This equates to about \$71 for 52 weeks. Discussion was made on how we can work to sustain this increase. Dave explained the times that we transfer funds from the general fund to the building fund (Vanguard) will probably not happen as frequently. James Peters brought to the attention that we, as members, hopefully will bring more members to our church, and giving will increase. M/S/C to accept the budget.
- Dave Swift reviewed the proposed 2025 service times and dates. M/S/A to accept as presented.
- Dave Swift presented the two project funding requests given to the Endowment Committee. They were as follows: 1) A \$1,000/year recurring request by the Sunday school children to be able to sponsor a child. Updates would be given to the congregation on a quarterly basis. 2) A \$1,000/year recurring request by Youth Group/Sunday school kids to be able to offer a free meal and entertainment on the last night of VBS for families and the community. M/S/A to accept both.

#### • Volunteers/Staff Elections

- O Council Pam Martin has completed her second term on the council. Barb Buckentin and Dawn Norrbom have completed their first term and will serve a second. Jerome Karl volunteered to be on the council. M/S/C to elect Jerome to the council for his first term.
- o **Ice Cream Social Committee** June 12<sup>th</sup>, 2025. Brenda Garoutte, Jody Sanken, Julie Karl, Michelle Moyer, and Jayme Sparby volunteered to take on this task again!
- Financial Review Committee Pam Martin, Brenda Garoutte, and Brian Alsleben will stay on the committee.
- O Benevolence Committee Elaine Carrigan and Mavis Mielke will stay on and Susie Blackbird volunteered to join them.
- 160<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Committee Brian and Michelle Alsleben, Brenda Schaefer, and Grace Garoutte.
- Nursery Committee It was decided that Michelle Alsleben will put a sign-up sheet on the bulletin board and a committee is no longer needed.
- Youth Group Leaders Dawn Norrbom, Andrea Wigern, and anyone else that would like to join them.
- o **Records Keeper** Karen Konerza
- o M/S/C to accept the above committee volunteers.

Dave had some miscellaneous information that was discussed. 1) Because of positive feedback, we will keep using name tags on the third Sunday of each month. The usher duties will be updated to have them put out the tags and markers on that Sunday. 2) He is looking into lighting changes so that evening services are not so dark. 3) A/V changes are being looked at. Buying our own equipment, wiring issues, adequate space, etc. Being the project is expected to be over \$5,000.00; it will likely be brought to a congregational vote later in the year.

A motion was made and seconded to adjourn the meeting. Motion carried.
