

A month later, the woman is surprised to see a nice clean wash on the line and says to her husband: "Look, she's finally learned how to wash correctly. I wonder who taught her this? " The husband replies, "I got up early this morning and cleaned our windows." And so it is with life... What we see depends on the clarity of the window through which we look.

as it is written:

"What no eye has seen,
what no ear has heard,
and what no human mind has conceived"
the things God has prepared for those who love him—

The Spirit searches all things, even the deep things of God. ¹¹ For who knows a person's thoughts except their own spirit within them? In the same way no one knows the thoughts of God except the Spirit of God. ¹² What we have received is not the spirit of the world, but the Spirit who is from God, so that we may understand what God has freely given us. ¹³ This is what we speak, not in words taught us by human wisdom but in words taught by the Spirit, explaining spiritual realities with Spirit-taught words. ^[c] ¹⁴ The person without the Spirit does not accept the things that come from the Spirit of God but considers them foolishness, and cannot understand them because they are discerned only through the Spirit. ¹⁵ The person with the Spirit makes judgments about all things, but such a person is not subject to merely human judgments, ¹⁶ for,

¹⁰ these are the things God has revealed to us by his Spirit.


SUNDAY SCHOOL HAPPENINGS

- June 25th the youth group scraped and painted the shed at church. We went for a quick swim over at the Swifts pond to cool off after finishing our painting project.






 July 17th we made decorations for VBS and also put a second coat of paint on the shed.





