

⁴ It is impossible for those who have once been enlightened, who have tasted the heavenly gift, who have shared in the Holy Spirit, ⁵ who have tasted the goodness of the word of God and the powers of the coming age ⁶ and who have fallen^[c] away, to be brought back to repentance. To their loss they are crucifying the Son of God all over again and subjecting him to public disgrace. Hebrews 6:4-6

In our adult Sunday School Class this fall we are studying he book of Hebrews. In chapter 6 is raised a very disturbing question. Can a believer lose his or her salvation? I believe the clear teaching of scripture is, no, a believer cannot lose his or her salvation. Let me share with you a number of passages that clearly teach that our salvation in Christ is eternally secure.

Romans 8, verse 1... Therefore, there is now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus. Paul expands that great truth in verse 33... Who will bring any charge against those whom God has chosen? It is God who justifies.

If God has declared that there is no condemnation for those who are in Christ, then who in all creation would dare to bring a charge against one who has been justified through faith in the blood of Christ? There is no one. Paul continues his declaration in verses 34-37... Who then is the one who condemns? No one. Christ Jesus who died—more than that, who was raised to life—is at the right hand of God and is also interceding for us. The shall separate us from the love of Christ? Shall trouble or hardship or persecution or famine or nakedness or danger or sword? As it is written: For your sake we face death all day long; we are considered as sheep to be slaughtered. The shall these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us.

If further assurance is needed, we have verses 38 and 39... For I am convinced that neither death nor life, neither angels nor demons, [k] neither the present nor the future, nor any powers, ³⁹ neither height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord.

Here we are given the guarantee that nothing can separate us from the love of God. Nothing that is seen, nothing that is unseen, nothing that is natural, nothing that is supernatural can separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus.

Jesus himself in John chapter 10 gives this tremendous statement about our absolute security in him... My sheep listen to my voice; I know them, and they follow me. ²⁸ I give them eternal life, and they shall

never perish; no one will snatch them out of my hand. ²⁹ My Father, who has given them to me, is greater than $all^{[c]}$; no one can snatch them out of my Father's hand.

In John chapter 3, verse 36 we find these words... Whoever believes in the Son has eternal life. And in John 5:24 Jesus assures us... "Very truly I tell you, whoever hears my word and believes him who sent me has eternal life and will not be judged but has crossed over from death to life.

How grateful we should be today that we have in Christ a fixed and sure salvation! If you are unsure of your eternal destiny today may this be the day that you find it by placing the full weight of your trust and confidence in Christ and his promises.

What we've been doing:




Looking Ahead:


- November we will package shoeboxes for Operation Christmas Child.


