Woman and the Fork

There was a young woman who had been diagnosed with a terminal illness and had been given three months to live. So as she was getting her things 'in order,' she contacted her Pastor and had him come to her house to discuss certain aspects of her final wishes.

She told him which songs she wanted sung at the service, what scriptures she would like read, and what outfit she wanted to be buried in.

Everything was in order and the Pastor was preparing to leave when the young woman suddenly remembered something very important to her.

'There's one more thing,' she said excitedly..

'What's that?' came the Pastor's reply?

'This is very important,' the young woman continued. 'I want to be buried with a fork in my right hand.'

The Pastor stood looking at the young woman, not knowing quite what to say.

That surprises you, doesn't it?' the young woman asked.

'Well, to be honest, I'm puzzled by the request,' said the Pastor.

The young woman explained. 'My grandmother once told me this story, and from that time on I have always tried to pass along its message to those I love and those who are in need of encouragement. In all my years of attending socials and dinners, I always remember that when the dishes of the main course were being cleared, someone would inevitably lean over and say, 'Keep your fork.' It was my favorite part because I knew that something better was coming...like velvety chocolate cake or deep-dish apple pie. Something wonderful, and with substance!'

So, I just want people to see me there in that casket with a fork in my hand and I want them to wonder 'What's with the fork?' Then I want you to tell them: 'Keep your fork .. the best is yet to come.'

The Pastor's eyes welled up with tears of joy as he hugged the young woman good-bye. He knew this would be one of the last times he would see her before her death. But he also knew that the young woman had a better grasp of heaven than he did. She had a better grasp of what heaven would be like than many people twice her age, with twice as much experience and knowledge. She KNEW that something better was coming.

At the funeral people were walking by the young woman's casket and they saw the cloak she was wearing and the fork placed in her right hand. Over and over, the Pastor heard the question, 'What's with the fork?' And over and over he smiled.

During his message, the Pastor told the people of the conversation he had with the young woman shortly before she died. He also told them about The fork and about what it symbolized to her. He told the people how he could not stop thinking about the fork and told them that they probably would not be able to stop thinking about it either.

He was right. So the next time you reach down for your fork let it remind you, ever so gently, that the best is yet to come. Friends are a very rare jewel, indeed. They make you smile and encourage you to succeed. Cherish the time you have, and the memories you share. Being friends with someone is not an opportunity, but a sweet responsibility. And just remember... keep your fork!

¹² Just as a body, though one, has many parts, but all its many parts form one body, so it is with Christ...¹⁴ Even so the body is not made up of one part but of many...¹⁵ Now if the foot should say, "Because I am not a hand, I do not belong to the body," it would not for that reason stop being part of the body. ¹⁶ And if the ear should say, "Because I am not an eye, I do not belong to the body," it would not for that reason stop being part of the body. ¹⁷ If the whole body were an eye, where would the sense of hearing be? If the whole body were an ear, where would the sense of smell be? 18 But in fact God has placed the parts in the body, every one of them, just as he wanted them to be. I Corinthians 12 The church, like the human body, is made up of many members. And each member is important to the proper functioning of the Body of Christ. Some members may seem less significant than others when in reality each member of the Body of Christ is important to its proper functioning. Some may think that the pastor is the most important member of a local church. The pastor may be the most visible and may be charged with the important functions of preaching, teaching and leadership. But where would any church be without those men and women who teach the Sunday school classes, or serve on the church council, or play the organ, or sing in the choir, or compile and print the church bulletins and newsletters, or clean the church, or greet those who come to worship, or serve funeral lunches, or maintain the building and grounds, or provide leadership for the youth group, or provide care for younger children during the sermon time during worship. EVERY ONE is important and critical to proper functioning of every local church, and more specifically to the proper and healthy functioning of the Body of Christ at St. John's Church of Hassan Valley Township. Let me give you just a couple of examples that stick in my mind as evidence that the Body of Christ at St. John's is healthy and functioning in a manner that is pleasing to the Head of the Church, Christ Jesus. A few weeks ago Casey Blackbird said he would like to teach a youth Bible study. Casey is a junior in high school. How often does something like that happen? Not very often. Praise God for Casey's initiative and willingness to provide a wonderful function in the life of our church. Another example involves the need for two new Council members. Preschoolers:

We can find books of the Bible faster.





Looking Ahead:


- * Bible Study will be every Wednesday night from 7-8. All kids in Youth Group are welcome. The topic is "Your Word is Truth".




