REFLECTIONS

God's Wife IT WILL KNOCK YOUR SOCKS OFF

Author and lecturer Leo Buscaglia once Talked about a contest he was asked to judge. The purpose of the contest was to find the most caring child.

Annual Meeting Minutes January 17th, 2016

President Dave Swift called the meeting to order. Pastor Bob Taylor opened the meeting with prayer.
