PASTOR'S NOTES



On November 20, 2016, a congregational meeting has been called for the purpose of adopting proposed changes to our constitution and articles of incorporation. New language concerning the church's position on same sex marriage and other sexual orientation issues will also be included reflecting the clear teachings of the scriptures of the Old and New Testaments on these issues.

Below are the key changes to the Constitution that are being proposed (changes in italics):

Under Article IV: Faith and Covenant, 1. Faith: we are recommending that the following wording be added to this section of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of St. John's Church:

This church acknowledges that God has established marriage as a lifelong, exclusive relationship between one man and one woman and that all intimate sexual activity outside the marriage relationship, whether heterosexual, homosexual, or otherwise, is immoral and therefore sin (Genesis 2:24-25; Exodus 20:14,17,22, 22:19; Leviticus 18:22-23, 20:13, 15-16; Matthew 19:4-6,9; Romans 1:18-31; I Corinthians 6:9-10, 15-20; I Timothy 1:8-11; Jude 7). It believes that God created the human race male and female and that all conduct with the intent to adopt a gender other than one's birth gender is immoral and therefore sin (Genesis 1:27; Deuteronomy 22:5).

2. Statement of Faith: This congregation also accepts reciting other statements of faith, such as the Nicene or Apostolic Creeds, providing they in no way contradict out Statement of Faith *and the clear testimony of the Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments.*

3. Covenant: We covenant one with another to seek and respond to the Word and the will of God *as revealed in the Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments.*

Article V. Membership: 2. *Members shall affirm the Faith and Covenant as described in Article IV*

6. If a member or members persistently breach their responsibilities as members of this congregation as outlined in Article V, *Sections 2 and 3*

Article VI. Governing Body: A quorum shall consist of twenty percent (20%) of the members *unless the Laws of the State of Minnesota are more restrictive.*

5. (new) *The pastoral candidate shall affirm the Faith and Covenant as described in Article IV*

Article XII. Amendment: 2. Previous known versions of this document were adopted on September 14, 1951, January 16, 1972, January 21, 2001 *and October 5, 2003*

That a special meeting was duly called to review the proposed, revised amended Constitution and Articles of Incorporation of St. John's Church, located in Hassan Valley Township, County of McLeod, State of Minnesota. The meeting was held on *insert date.*

That a quorum (eliminate the words "of twenty percent (20%)") of the members assembled at the church for the purpose of approving the above revised amendments, Constitution, and Articles of Incorporation.

Other policies such as building use and personnel will also be changing to reflect these changes to our constitution and articles of incorporation.

In the coming weeks, each member will receive a mailing with these proposed changes. Also a copy of these proposed changes will be posted at the church.

We would certainly encourage your presence and participation at this congregational meeting to be held immediately following the worship service on November 20, 2016.
