Pastor's Report



*For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith—and this is not from yourselves, it is the gift of God— *not by works, so that no one can boast. *For we are God's handiwork, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do. (Ephesians 2:8-10)

On July 14th, it was our privilege to host a *Shot Gun Blast* event featuring Aaron Gould. The Gould brothers are nationally known for their exhibition trick shooting. But more importantly they use their high-profile platform to share their Christian testimony.

A number of our youth have been actively involved in the sport of trap shooting, among them Eli Sladek and Jessica Alsleben. Their moms, have had the vision of bringing the Gould brothers here for as an evangelistic outreach event, for some time. But the cost involved seemed overwhelming. But with God all things are possible. And with the help of Grace Church in Silver Lake, Roxanne and Michelle found a way to make this event a reality.

And what a glorious day it was. We prayed for great weather and it was a great day, and even though it was extremely warm, a nice breeze made the heat bearable. Although there was a chance of scattered thunderstorms, the thunderstorms didn't move in until the show and the cleanup was over. Praise God for his faithfulness.

Before the event, we had worship outdoors in the church parking lot. And that morning, as I looked out over the church grounds where this event was to be held, I thought back several years when, in pursuit of additional parking space for large events like the annual Ice Cream Social, the congregation decided to take one acre of farm land that we own and seed it for additional parking and a lovely area that could be used for VBS and other events as well. And as I thought about that decision and the events that would soon be unfolding at St. John's, I couldn't help but be overwhelmed by God's provision in advance, for the space that would be needed to put on such an event as this. And as I looked out, I could see an area for archery, an area to serve a free meal, enough room for games and face painting, etc. Bleachers were strategically placed not only for viewing the shooting demonstration but also to provide shade for the spectators who would come. Blackbird had a dog obedience demonstration. And that extra acre of grass provided the room necessary for that demonstration and for Aaron to do his trick shooting and give his testimony. And all that unfolded on July 14th could not have happened unless God had given us the wisdom years before to seed that area for parking and an event such as this. - Shelving for library The council still doesn't have a good answer for a location and will continue thinking.
- Storage options for Sunday School Jodi Sanken and Gene Konerza looked at current Sunday School closets and discussed some shelving options to increase useful storage.
- Jodi Sanken will follow-up with Sunday School teachers and parents about possibly switching start times to have Sunday School following the worship service.
- Common Cup display area Celine has the materials but is still looking for a small enough table to fit the intended location.
- New sign by elevator button, sanctuary level The sign is here and ready to be installed. Hopefully this will help people remember not to stack chairs in front of the elevator button.

New Business:

- Jodi Sanken discussed ideas about how to get parents more involved and proposed displaying a special bulletin board with tasks that parents can help with. Even simple tasks like sharpening pencils could be helpful. Jodi will work with other Sunday School teachers to populate the board. In the short term the board will be on an easel in the entryway. When established, a more permanent location will be found for it to hang.
- Faith Center to do list:

- O Various follow-up tasks that Friendship homes has to do: Fix air gap that allowed frost to form in the passageway, East door threshold needs adjustment, missing shingles, kitchen counter gap, etc.
- o Proposal to remove the door on the north side of the passageway and frame out the opening.
- Rough landscaping is done (extra driveway removed, backfilling, sidewalk base buildup, surface contoured for drainage). Still need to smooth surface and prep for grass seeding late fall or early spring. (Update: first wave of tilling and picking up rocks/sticks is complete. Special thanks to Dave Swift, Dave Huebert, and the Youth Group!)
- o Install sidewalk and build ramp to the east door. The design has been modified to shorten the ramp from its original design and have an inclined sidewalk.
- o M/S/A to put retaining wall on west side of sidewalk at a cost of around \$200.
- o Landscape rock will be used under the ramp and in the areas that can't be mowed.
- o Install air conditioner and bury phone line
- Gould Brothers event Michelle Alsleben and Roxanne Sladek are working with Grace Bible Church. Aaron Gould will bring his own sound system. Mike Norrbom will also bring sound equipment for the outdoor church service.
- The parking lot is in need of repair/resurfacing again. The last resurfacing was done in June 2017. Dave Huebert will get pricing information for doing it again.
- M/S/A to clean carpets and wax floors. Chairs/tables/etc. will need to be moved to the Faith Center on Sunday 8/4 after the service. The carpet and basement will be done over two weeks.
- Council is questioning if we have too many of the red chairs and if we can get rid of some since it is hard to find places to stack them all. Similarly, do we need the brown chairs in the basement? This discussion was tabled until it is decided where Adult and 7th/8th grades Sunday School classes will be held going forward.





• May 1st was flower delivery day. Another successful fundraiser and beautiful flowers!!!








Before the flowers, there was a meal and a celebration for the two graduates, Isaac and Adam! We wish them the best in their future.

• July 17th we met at church and grilled supper and worked on VBS decorating.


