REFLECTIONS

Too Busy for a Friend.....

One day a teacher asked her students to list the names of the other students in the room on two sheets of paper, leaving a space between each name.

Then she told them to think of the nicest thing they could say about each of their classmates and write it down.

It took the remainder of the class period to finish their assignment, and as the students left the room, each one handed in the papers.

That Saturday, the teacher wrote down the name of each student on a separate sheet of paper, and listed what everyone else had said about that individual.

On Monday she gave each student his or her list. Before long, the entire class was smiling. 'Really?' she heard whispered. 'I never knew that I meant anything to anyone!' and, 'I didn't know others liked me so much,' were most of the comments.

No one ever mentioned those papers in class again. She never knew if they discussed them after class or with their parents, but it didn't matter.

The exercise had accomplished its purpose. The students were happy with themselves and one another. That group of students moved on.

Several years later, one of the students was killed in Vietnam and his teacher attended the funeral of that special student. She had never seen a serviceman in a military coffin before. He looked so handsome, so mature.

The church was packed with his friends. One by one those who loved him took a last walk by the coffin. The teacher was the last one to bless the coffin.

As she stood there, one of the soldiers who acted

as pallbearer came up to her. 'Were you Mark's math teacher?' he asked. She nodded: 'yes.' Then he said: 'Mark talked about you a lot.'

After the funeral, most of Mark's former classmates went together to a luncheon. Mark's mother and father were there, obviously waiting to speak with his teacher.

'We want to show you something,' his father said, taking a wallet out of his pocket 'They found this on Mark when he was killed.. We thought you might recognize it.'

Opening the billfold, he carefully removed two worn pieces of notebook paper that had obviously been taped, folded and refolded many times. The teacher knew without looking that the papers were the ones on which she had listed all the good things each of Mark's classmates had said about him.

'Thank you so much for doing that,' Mark's mother said. 'As you can see, Mark treasured it.'

All of Mark's former classmates started to gather around.

Charlie smiled rather sheepishly and said, 'I still have my list. It's in the top drawer of my desk at home.'

Chuck's wife said, 'Chuck asked me to put his in our wedding album.'

'I have mine too,' Marilyn said. 'It's in my diary'

Then Vicki, another classmate, reached into her pocketbook, took out her wallet and showed her worn and frazzled list to the group. 'I carry this with me at all times,' Vicki said and without batting an eyelash, she continued 'I think we all saved our lists'

That's when the teacher finally sat down and cried. She cried for Mark and for all his friends who would never see him again.

The density of people in society is so thick that we forget that life will end one day. And we don't know when that one day will be.

So please, tell the people you love and care for, that they are special and important. Tell them, before it is too late.

I believe I put this in a newsletter a few years back, but I came across it again and thought it maybe repeated again. We've had a bad 2020 and we all forget because we haven't seen all friends during these difficult time **Karen**

Pastor's Report

Now, brothers and sisters, about times and dates we do not need to write to you, ² for you know very well that the day of the Lord will come like a thief in the night. ³ While people are saying, "Peace and safety," destruction will come on them suddenly, as labor pains on a pregnant woman, and they will not escape. I Thessalonians 5:2,3

Jan Markell, in here most recent issue of "*Understanding the Times*", reminds us that last day events happen quickly and even suddenly. The Greek word "quickly" is *tachos* is used eight times in the book of *Revelation*.

We often see sudden destruction falling upon the wicked in the bible. The unrepentant living during Noah's time experienced a sudden and catastrophic flood (Gen. 6-9). They had 12- years to repent as Noah preached to them, but they chose to ignore him and judgment suddenly fell (Gen. 6:3-7).

In 2020, everything has happened suddenly.

- Our fairly ordinary world suddenly vanished.
- Stores sold out.
- Fear gripped America and the world, suddenly.
- People were ordered to suddenly change their lifestyles.
- People lost businesses suddenly.
- A U.S. President went from popular to "the cause of it all" suddenly.
- Reality became altered suddenly.
- Cities, turned into ghost towns suddenly.
- Mankind became lovers of life, treacherous, and without self-control suddenly.
- Virtual became the new way of doing virtually suddenly.
- The U.S. economy went from the best ever to horrible suddenly.
- Churches went from essential to irreverent in the eyes of the world suddenly.
- Order turned into chaos suddenly with racial tension.
- That tension suddenly turned to lawlessness.

- Lawlessness turned to anarchy suddenly.
- The cry for police protection suddenly turned to "abolish the police."
- Common sense suddenly turned to strong delusion.

Is there a message in all of this? Something else will happen suddenly – the Rapture of the Church! It will take place in a twinkling of an eye. Could it be that God is telling us that something of eternal significance is about to happen? Could the Rapture of the Church be coming anytime soon? It certainly could, even tomorrow. Are you ready for that life changing moment? Paul describes that critical moment of time for us in I Thessalonians chapter 4:14-18.

¹⁴ For we believe that Jesus died and rose again, and so we believe that God will bring with Jesus those who have fallen asleep in him. ¹⁵ According to the Lord's word, we tell you that we who are still alive, who are left until the coming of the Lord, will certainly not precede those who have fallen asleep. ¹⁶ For the Lord himself will come down from heaven, with a loud command, with the voice of the archangel and with the trumpet call of God, and the dead in Christ will rise first. ¹⁷ After that, we who are still alive and are left will be caught up together with them in the clouds to meet the Lord in the air. And so we will be with the Lord forever. ¹⁸ Therefore encourage one another with these words.
