REFLECTIONS

His name was Fleming, and he was a poor Scottish farmer. One day, while trying to make a living for his family, he heard a cry for help coming from a nearby bog. He dropped his tools and ran to the bog. There, mired to his waist in black muck, was a terrified boy, screaming and struggling to free himself. Farmer Fleming saved the lad from what could have been a slow and terrifying death.

The next day, a fancy carriage pulled up to the Scotsman's sparse surroundings. An elegantly dressed nobleman stepped out and introduced himself as the father of the boy Farmer Fleming had saved. 'I want to repay you,' said the nobleman. 'You saved my son's life.'

'No, I can't accept payment for what I did,' the Scottish farmer replied waving off the offer. At that moment, the farmer's own son came to the door of the family hovel.

'Is that your son?' the nobleman asked. 'Yes,' the farmer replied proudly.

Pastor's Report



²⁴ And let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds, ²⁵ not giving up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but encouraging one another—and all the more as you see the Day approaching. Hebrews 10:24,25

As your pastor, it has been wonderful to be able to see and talk to many of you in person. These past months have been difficult. Mary and I love each of you deeply and it has been very difficult to not have the opportunity to "fellowship" with you. So, what is "Christian fellowship" any way?

In the first chapter of his first letter, John makes it clear that Christian fellowship is more than just enjoying "hanging out" with one another.

That which was from the beginning, which we have heard, which we have seen with our eyes, which we have looked at and our hands have touched—this we proclaim concerning the Word of life. ² The life appeared; we have seen it and testify to it, and we proclaim to you the eternal life, which was with the Father and has appeared to us. ³ We proclaim to you what we have seen and heard, so that you also may have fellowship with us. And our fellowship is with the Father and with his Son, Jesus Christ. ⁴ We write this to make our joy complete.

Christian fellowship is about the bond that we share in knowing and loving and serving Christ. Our fellowship is with the Father and with his Son, Jesus Christ. Genuine Christian fellowship begins with the bond we share because of the reality of Christ in our lives. And through Him, the fellowship we have with the Father and the Holy Spirit. Because of what Christian has done for us, by faith, we are adopted into the family of God and are introduced into that marvelous fellowship that God the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit have enjoyed for all eternity; fellowship that Adam and Eve also enjoyed before sin entered the world through them.

And so, Mary and I loved you, the members and friends of St. John's Church, not primarily because you are such wonderful people but because of the bond we share in Christ. Christ, living in each of us is what attracts us to one another. And not only that but also

with many we come in contact with along the way, who also know and love and serve the Savior. You meet someone you haven't seen in decades, but because of the love of Christ that you share, that intimacy, the bond reignites that closeness, that fellowship that you share because of Christ.

Another dimension of Christian fellowship that makes it so special is the fact that it benefits everyone involved. The verses from Hebrews chapter 10 that I referenced earlier certainly drive home that point.

One of the reasons that Christian fellowship is so important is because it spurs us on towards love and good deeds; it encourages us in our walk with Christ; it refocuses our eyes and hearts on Christ and the love that we share in Him; it allows us to encourage one another to even greater love and faithfulness as we see the Day approaching; the day of Christ's Second Coming when all of His promises to those who love Him will find their fulfilment. And genuine Christian fellowship not only is about the here and now, it about what will be for all eternity if we remain faithful to Him. It certainly is a wonderful bond that we share with Him and with the Father and with the Holy Spirit.
