- Mid-MN will check the alarms on the septic tank and pump it out.
- Cory checked into a handicap button for the front door. He gave the council an idea of what it could cost plus the labor of an electrician. Joe will talk with Frank when he contacts him for the timer and flood light to get an idea of the work involved. Council will discuss at our next meeting.
- Cory ordered the plexiglass for the outside sign and will replace it. He also took care of changing out the furnace filters.
- Joe is looking for a new file cabinet for storing important documents that need to be retained.

New Business:

- The council had discussion with Barry Marchant. Barry had some question regarding Pastoral Care and being able to make visitations in person. He noted that he was more than happy to send cards or make phone calls when visits did not work. The council reviewed the last member book with him and gave him some family history on our members. Dear Saint John's Church of Biscay,

Thank you for your consideration and for having me come preach and meet with you all. After prayer, reflection, and discussion with wise friends and family, Ashley and I have decided to withdraw my name from consideration for the pastoral opening at St. John's.

My appeal to you is the same as Paul's to the Corinthians: "I appeal to you, by the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that all of you agree, and that there be no divisions among you, but that you be united in the same mind and the same judgment" (1 Cor. 1:10). My appeal is that your mind and judgment would be united in and based on Scripture; not governed by traditions or man-made documents but by the Word of God. In meeting with you on Sunday, it was clearly evidenced that some in your congregation oppose the Word of God in favor of tradition.

My prayer for you is that the Bible—God's breathed-out Word—would take precedence among you. There are many of you who do this, and how you engaged with me was evidence of your commitment to Jesus and his Bible. Some who even disagreed with my convictions did so with conviction from Scripture and in a way that evidenced the fruit of the Spirit. But there were many who treated me in a clearly unchristian way, and those who did so typically handled their traditions and various documents with a higher regard than how they handled the Bible. Too many people fell into this second category, leading me to believe that it would be unwise to bring my wife and son to partner with St. John's in ministry.

My prayer for some of you is that you will turn away from your worldly traditions and follow God's teachings. I pray that the unconverted among you will repent and believe. I pray that you find a pastor whose governing authority is the Word of God. Finally, I pray that the believing and biblically faithful among you would be able to order your church around the Bible so that you "may present everyone fully mature in Christ" (Col. 1:28).

Giving Opportunity

First Lutheran School of Glencoe has seen an increase in enrollment in that it has almost doubled since 2019. With the increase in enrollment has come an increase in need for tuition assistance. For the first time I can recall, our tuition assistance fund has been depleted. Because of this, we have lost new families and we were also not able to award amounts to some current families they qualified for. We also have other families who are awarded aide and are still not able to afford the amount left they are to pay. First Lutheran School is a place where the students learn about God's word every day in their opening devotions, religion classes and chapel services. I feel so blessed to work in a place where we are allowed to pray for and with our students. For some kids, this is the only place they get to hear about Jesus. Those same kids take what they learn in school and bring the good news home to their parents. The school is truly a mission field in the Glencoe and Hutchinson areas. If you feel led to donate to the tuition aide fund, you can make your donation out to First Lutheran School and put "tuition aide" in the memo line. Donations can be given to me and I will give you a receipt for tax purposes.

In addition to the need for tuition assistance, there is also a need in the lunch program. For families who qualify for free or reduced lunches their main meal is covered by the program. What is not covered are the milks during milk break or any seconds taken at lunch. If there are no funds in the family's account the student is not able to have those things as there is no other fund to cover those expenses. If you feel led to "adopt a student" in the lunch program, you can make your check payable to First Lutheran School and in the memo line put "lunch fund".
